
Thank You!

Information From Gabriel

During this crazy summer 2020, we continue to monitor all the developments in

the world of education, specifically music education, to be ready to tackle the fall in full force. The ACDA (American Choral Directors Association) released a very useful document that encourages us, teachers and choral conductors, to be ready for a threefold scenario in September.

Scenario 1, Face to Face Instruction. We meet in smaller rotating groups, with singers ten feet apart. Everyone should wear masks and follow strict protocols about socializing. The venue will be disinfected immediately before use.

Scenario 2, Hybrid instruction. We still meet in person once a week but we add Zoom rehearsals and events though which we continue to develop our musicianship skills.

Scenario 3, Remote Instruction. This is what we have been doing since mid-March, but we will take it to a new level, adding special guests and assignments that will enhance the chorister's experience so we are ready to be amazing when it is time to come back to the live stage!

Happy July everyone! Be on the lookout for our Canticle of Brother Sun virtual choir coming out soon. There will be an incredible guest singer joining us there, in the virtual space!!
